Biographical/Historical Note (545)

The City of Seabrook was developed in 1832 when Ritson Morris, a native of Virginia, purchased a league of land from the Mexican government. In 1895, Seabrook W. Sydnor purchased a small portion of that land. The area attracted local farmers, fishermen and merchants. Many years later in 1961, the city was incorporated and became the City of Seabrook.

Scope and Content (520)

The collection contains 1 box of materials pertaining to the history of the City of Seabrook. The collection includes photographs, newspaper articles, transcripts, manuscripts, and magazines.
