



Constitutional Amendments

ARTICLE III Section 4.B

Council member vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the president of the Student Association with the advice of the Administrative Committee and consent of two-thirds (2/3) of the council present.

ARTICLE III Section 5.E

The second session of the new term shall not be adjourned until all committees and chairpersons have been elected.

ARTICLE III Section 6

The council shall have general legislative powers, including the following:
Be responsible for the appointment of all student members of the University Cultural Committee, including the Student Co-Chair of the UCC.

ARTICLE III Section 7 (last sentence)

Persons duly charged by the Judicial Council and found guilty by the concurrence of two-thirds (2/3) of the total members of the council shall be removed from office.

ARTICLE IV Section 6.A

(The President shall) Preside over the Student Association Council and shall have no vote except in the case of a tie.

ARTICLE IV Section 7.B

(The ^{Vice} President shall) Serve as a voting member of the Student Association Council when not serving in the President's absence.

ARTICLE IV Section 7.D (Add)

(The Vice President shall) Serve as chairperson of the Administrative Committee.

ARTICLE V Section 1 Student Cultural Committee

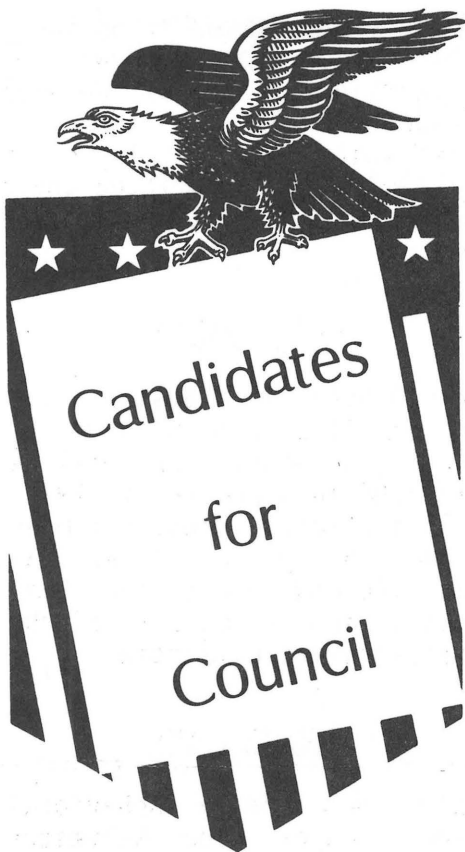
The Student Cultural Committee shall work co-operatively with University Cultural Committee in their responsibility for scheduling and implementing the film, lecture and fine art series.

ARTICLE VI Section 1

Amendments may be proposed by the Council by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership of the Council voting or by a petition for amendment signed by one-fourth (1/4) of the total number of students voting in the last general election.

Dick Gartner is a Futures graduate student who works part

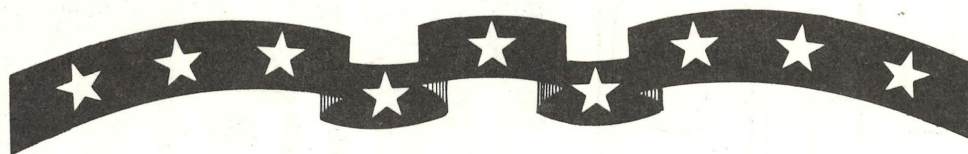
Dick Gartner is a Futures graduate student from Galveston who works part-time and carries 9 hours. He will graduate in the fall, 1977.

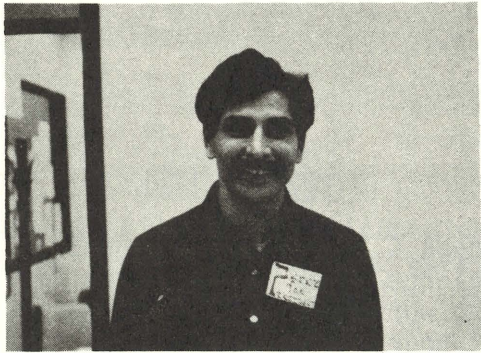
BILL T. YONLEY

Qualifications: SAC '76, Lecture co-chairperson on the University Cultural Committee, and the Council on Student Affairs.

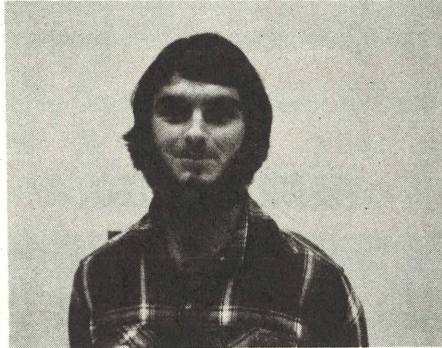

Candidates for President



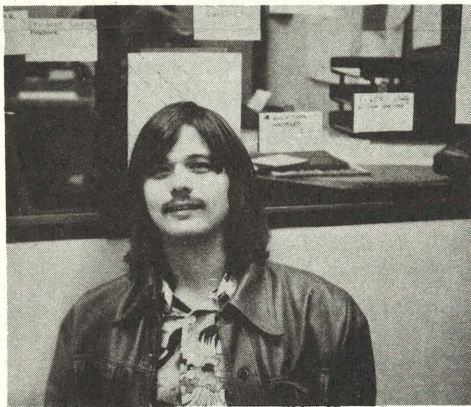
DAVID PEREZ
