





He/she establishes the administrative and academic structure for the University; chairs the University Council as a component of the shared governance structure; promotes academic excellence through planning, budgeting, implementation, and assessment; makes recommendations on legislative appropriations, annual operating budgets, capital construction projects, and priorities for private support. He/she serves as the University's chief external officer, provides leadership for administration and faculty to fulfill the University's mission, and serves as the official representative of the University and as liaison for communication between the System and the administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost


The Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost serves as the senior administrative and chief academic officer who reports directly to the President of the University. Emphasis is placed on responsiveness to university constituencies and working through a strong, shared governance model. 
Vice President for Administration and Finance


Associate Vice President for University Advancement

These expanded experiences include a two-semester internship/student teaching experience, public school-based university coursework, and close cooperation with many schools designated as Professional Development School sites. These school sites regard every staff member as a mentor who fosters a rich, supportive environment for preparing professional teachers. Field experiences vary from one day each week during the public school semester to every day for the entire semester, depending on specific requirements of a particular program. The CPDT works with Professional Development Schools in local public school districts to coordinate all field experiences as part of teacher certification and graduate professional certification.



Small classes currently generate state funded hours. Special Note: If your course was miscoded (i.e., you listed it as a lecture rather than an individualized or thesis course—your average class size will be lower than it should be. Courses with 3 or fewer students were excluded for this purpose.






Headcount Trends









Student Credit Hour Trends







School of Science and Computer Engineering - Student Distribution by Residence Dot Density by Student Level within 10 & 15 mile Radius of UHCL









Dot Density by Student Level within 10 & 15 mile Radius of UHCL









Dot Density by Student Level within 10 & 15 mile Radius of UHCL







The mission of the Health Center is to promote academic excellence, retention, and graduation through optimizing the health of students, faculty, and staff. ISS promotes the retention and empowerment of a diverse student population including racial/ethnic groups, first-generation, women, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, international, and underrepresented students. Through educational programs and services, we facilitate the growth of culturally competent, respectful and well-rounded global citizens.

Goals

The goals of the Intercultural Student Services Office are to:

- Assist students with their transition to UHCL
- Provide educational and cultural programming and services
- Facilitate student learning and develop leadership skills
- Promote student participation in IISS programs and services
- Enhance and expand university-wide partnerships
- Cultivate collaboration with student organizations
- Increase community outreach and partnerships
- Serve as a referral source and advocate for students
- Foster a supportive mentoring environment
- Encourage life-long learning

Programs and Services

On average, approximately 7,000 participants directly participate in LISS sponsored programs and services each year. Programs and services include:

Intercultural Awareness Experiences - On-going educational programs provide the UHCL community participants the opportunity to enhance their global perspectives. We have various programs and events throughout the year that focus on all types of cultures. For example, we sponsor events to recognize Hispanic Heritage, Black History, Asian American, and Native American Heritage Months. We also offer Global Expo and Cultural Extravaganza programs which highlight our students' global diversity.

Cultural Competency for Leaders - CCL is a diversity training workshop offered to university students, staff, faculty and administrators. Participants learn about leadership, diversity, and multiculturalism issues in higher education. The CCL is a university-wide ongoing mechanism to create a welcoming environment and to promote understanding and appreciation of diversity. CCL provides an institutional response to a variety of campus issues, including racial, inter-group, prejudice, and discrimination.

Student Advocacy—All students with concerns, problems, or students seeking advice may request assistance from the staff of ISS. The staff serves as a resource and advisor to individuals and groups of students. Additionally, when needed, the staff serves as mediator in conflict situations.

Programs and Services continued

Social Justice Leadership Training - *Social Justice* is a process and a goal. The goal of social justice education is full and equal participation of all groups in a society that is mutually shaped to meet their needs. Social justice includes a vision of society that is equitable and all members are physically and psychologically safe and secure.

Resource Center—The Office maintains a collection of periodicals, books, training manuals, newsletters, audiotapes, and videos on a variety of cultural topics. A checkout procedure allows campus community members to use the materials to enhance their educational development.

Women's and LGBT Services — A program that is committed to providing programs that serve the needs of women and LGBT constituencies. We are dedicated to working with groups of all backgrounds, ages, abilities, and educational status. The program complements the mission of the ISS Office to support and advocate on behalf of all students. Programs include Safe Zone, Sister-to-Sister, and EqualiTea.

Cultural Programs-ISS celebrates diversity on campus with a variety of cultural programs designed to enhance the campus community members' understanding of different cultural practices, beliefs, and histories.

Transition and Retention Services-educational, academic success, outreach and support programs for first generation, ethnically diverse and international students are offered. Other programs are Generation One, a learning community created to help incoming first generation freshmen and sophomore students to transition, adjust and negotiate the campus environment for a successful academic and social experience; I-Start assists new incoming and underrepresented international students (who are the only one or a small group of students from their country) with academic and social support that will lead to a successful transition; Student Ambassador/Peer Mentoring program for all new students.

Educational Partnerships

A variety of partnerships are undertaken to assist students in their educational growth, including:

Strictly Speaking Program assists international students in improving their spoken English skills by pairing international students with US

GPS (Guidance for Personal Success) workshops are a series of workshops that highlight different topics to assist new students during their first semester. The Do's and Don'ts of an On-campus Job Search provides tips and strategies on how to better present one's self to possible on-campus employment. Primary Services and Activities

Dean of Students – The Dean of Students assists the university community (i.e., students and faculty) by providing advocacy to resolve conflicts, develop strategies for addressing both individual and campus-wide concerns, and serves as a liaison to other university offices on behalf of the student body. The Dean of Students Office also enforces the Student Code of Conduct and serves as the chief conduct hearing officer for the campus.

Community College Advisory Council

2014-2015

When UHCL was established in 1971, the legislation provided for a statutorily created council of community and junior college presidents to advise the university president. This is the only such statutorily created advisory council in the state of Texas.

The statute provides for the Community College Advisory Council to consist of presidents/chancellors of each tax-supported community and junior college in Harris, Galveston, Fort Bend, Waller, Montgomery, Liberty, Chambers, and Brazoria counties. At the university's initiative, a bill was introduced and passed into law during the 1991 Legislative session to add Wharton to the list of counties.

The legislation calls for the advisory council to "periodically study the overall needs of the region" ... for the development of programs and resources in higher education, and as a result of its studies shall make recommendations to the board of regents of the University of Houston [System] regarding the development of the departments and degree programs of the [University of Houston-Clear Lake]. The board of regents shall give careful consideration to the recommendations of the advisory council."

The interaction of UHCL with its community and junior college partners is widely acknowledged as a state and national model of institutional cooperation and has been instrumental in the success of the university.


