Biographical/Historical Note (545):

Born in Frankfurt, Germany, January 26, 1921, Alfred R. Neumann arrived in the United States in 1937. He earned an A.B. from Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia, in 1940, an M.A. from the University of Kentucky in 1941, an A.M. from Harvard University in 1948, and a Ph.D. in German from the University of Michigan in 1951. In 1953, he was appointed an assistant professor at the University of Houston, eventually reaching the rank of professor. Neumann served as dean of the university's College of Arts & Sciences,

1958-1972. In 1972, he was appointed chancellor of the University of Houston at Clear Lake City, as the newly created campus was then known.

After seeing the University's enrollment grow to more than six thousand students, Newmann retired as chancellor August 31, 1982, and was named chancellor emeritus. On May 23, 1983, he was stricken by a heart attack and died, leaving his wife Selma and two children.

Neumann's many organizational affiliations included the South Central Modern Language Association (serving as its president) and the Southern Humanities Conference (as chairman). He was also president of the Houston Contemporary Music Society and the Houston Friends of Music and served as the program annotator for the Houston Symphony Orchestra and the Houston Grand Opera. In addition, he was active in the Houston Jewish Family Service and the Clear Lake Chamber of Commerce.

Neumann was recognized for his achievements, receiving an honorary doctorate of laws from Marshall University in 1964 and being named a distinguished alumnus of that university in 1974. The Federal German Republic awarded him the Order of Merit in 1964 and the Commander's Cross of the Order of Merit ten years later. Posthumous recognition came from the University of Houston System's Board of Regents, which named the library at the University of Houston at Clear Lake City in his honor.

Scope and Content (520):

Records of the founding chancellor, Alfred R. Neumann, of the University of Houston-Clear Lake. Although the folders were arranged in straight alphabetical order, they were reordered into distinct series during processing for ease of recognition and access. They include historical features (which focus on the University's founding, organization, and policies), general correspondence, planning records, accreditation files, grant and contract records, and extensive subject files. These are followed by membership records and subgroups, i.e., committees within and outside of the University on which Neumann served or which ultimately reported to him. The records are arranged within the folders in roughly reverse chronological order, and this arrangement has also been preserved across the folders except where a chronological ordering would make more sense.
