FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The student Library Use Fee is one of the library's major funding sources, the other being state funds. After four years of state budget cuts, the cumulative effect is being felt most definitely in the library's materials budget. Funding decreases as prices soar, something with which we're all familiar. Also factored into this simple but dramatic dynamic, however, is the migration from print to electronic formats. Once upon a time, printed books were purchased once, cataloged, processed, shelved, and circulated. In today's high tech environment, the library pays for access to ebooks on an annual basis. Since electronic formats are billed every year, there is an unfortunate opportunity for annual price increases. Some of the increases are mind-boggling as publishers pull content from aggregator databases and repackaging it to sell separately.

Electronic formats are much more expensive than print to start with, and given regular price increases, they become even more so. Librarians handle this shifting landscape by constantly re-evaluating usage, priorities, and need. All this adds up to a strong case for increasing the Library Use Fee. All of us want UHCL to be the best educational experience for our students. The library needs to serve them well and provide the best resources possible to help them achieve their goals. We are proud that our students have voted to increase the Library Use Fee, which they pay, in order to secure the very best.

- [OneSearch](#), the contents of which include almost all Neumann Library databases, the Library Catalog, and selected public domain digital collections such as ebooks from [Project Gutenberg](#) and from [HathiTrust Digital Library](#). Expand results even further by selecting *Add results beyond your library's collection* (under *Refine your search* on a results screen display). When full text isn't available, the *Citation Online* display now includes a big orange *Request* button that links to interlibrary loan forms.

Finding census facts just got easier



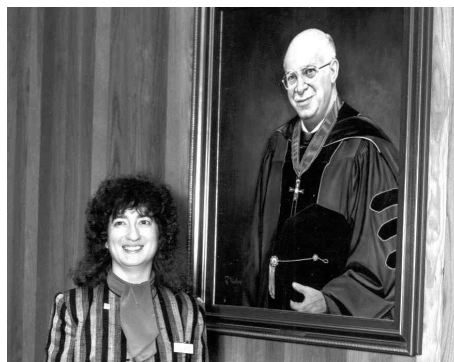

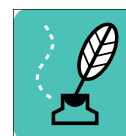
Library Catalog material types expanded
