All three pools were recently resurfaced. The pool is tentatively set to open the first weekend of June. Family pool passes can be purchased for \$60 from City Hall. ## **Seabrook Association Recycling Project**

The response to the recycling program during its first month has been terrific, thanks to the citizens of Seabrook. A few "bugs" must be worked out of the system, however, and we ask for your patience while this is being done. A larger bin is needed for paper and Best Waste is fabricating one. The bins will also be painted so they can be readily differentiated from trash bins. Meanwhile, keep the paper and aluminum coming, but REMEMBER -NO magazines or phone books. These cannot be recycled with newsprint because of the dye content in the paper. Also, only aluminum cans are acceptable - no scrap aluminum, please. Thanks for your continued support.



## **Seabrook Economic Development Commission (SEDC)**

The past few months were highlighted by a number of activities. On March 15, Chairman Veit Hansen was given the opportunity to address the Seabrook Association on the SEDC status. Highlighted in his presentation was the support the SEDC has lent to bringing new businesses to Seabrook. This includes Pirates Landing, a high quality apartment complex, for which ground breaking will be done very soon, and a hotel project which is currently in the final stages of negotiations. Currently, the Commission is studying the feasibility of a business park to be located in the northern part of town which would accomodate aerospace and other high technology industries. SEDC's Marketing Chairman, Roger Arnhart, has been busy with his committee to assemble a first rate program to brief developers and investors from the greater Houston area on the investment opportunities in our city and the high quality of life that Seabrook offers to its residents. This event is currently scheduled for the middle of May. The evaluation summary of the Seabrook Business Survey was recently finalized. Copies will be mailed out to those businesses who responded to the survey. Additional copies are available upon request. High on the list of priorities for the next few months is a plan to develop the potential of Old Town Seabrook and the development of a Fisherman's Wharf.
