What is the Study?

The City of Seabrook, through the Economic Development Corporation II (EDC II), is currently in the process of creating a strategic development plan for the area known as the South Seabrook Marine District.

The purpose of this plan is to identify ways in which the district can be enhanced by:


- · Supporting existing businesses,

The Planning Team

The City has named a Working Committee to guide the project and to report to the EDC II. This committee is made up of representatives of EDC II, City Council, and several citizens that represent many community interests.

The team of JJR and Development Strategies Inc., multi-disciplinary consulting firms that specialize in waterfront planning and design, has been hired by the city to create the plan.
