Theses & Dissertation Resources



In Fall 2015, the Neumann Library partnered with the Educational Leadership (EDLS) program to convert to an electronic process for thesis and dissertation submission and access, making it the first on campus to transition from print.

The <u>UHCL Dissertation Collection</u> now contains 18 dissertations written by EDLS doctoral graduates. These dissertations are fully open access and discoverable in Google Scholar and library catalogs. Usage statistics are visible for each dissertation, and some have accumulated over a hundred downloads from across the country and around the world!

He will also coordinate movement towards the university-wide implementation of electronic projects, theses and dissertations.
