When a child is marked below "C" in any subject, the parents are requested to see the teacher promptly.

Experience shows that the best results are obtained in cases where the parents make careful study of the reports and discuss them with the children.

The mark "-" indicates that the child is unsatisfactory in the habit so marked.

The mark "Av." indicates that the habit is formed to a fair degree of reliability, but that improvement is still possible.

The mark "+" indicates that the habit seems entirely satisfactory.

No mark indicates either that the habit is not being considered at the time, or that it is not clearly defined on either the negative or the positive side.

Improvement is expected in those habits marked "Av." and "-."

If a child continues to be unsatisfactory in an important habit, parents are urged to consult the teacher as to possible closer co-operation between the home and the school.
