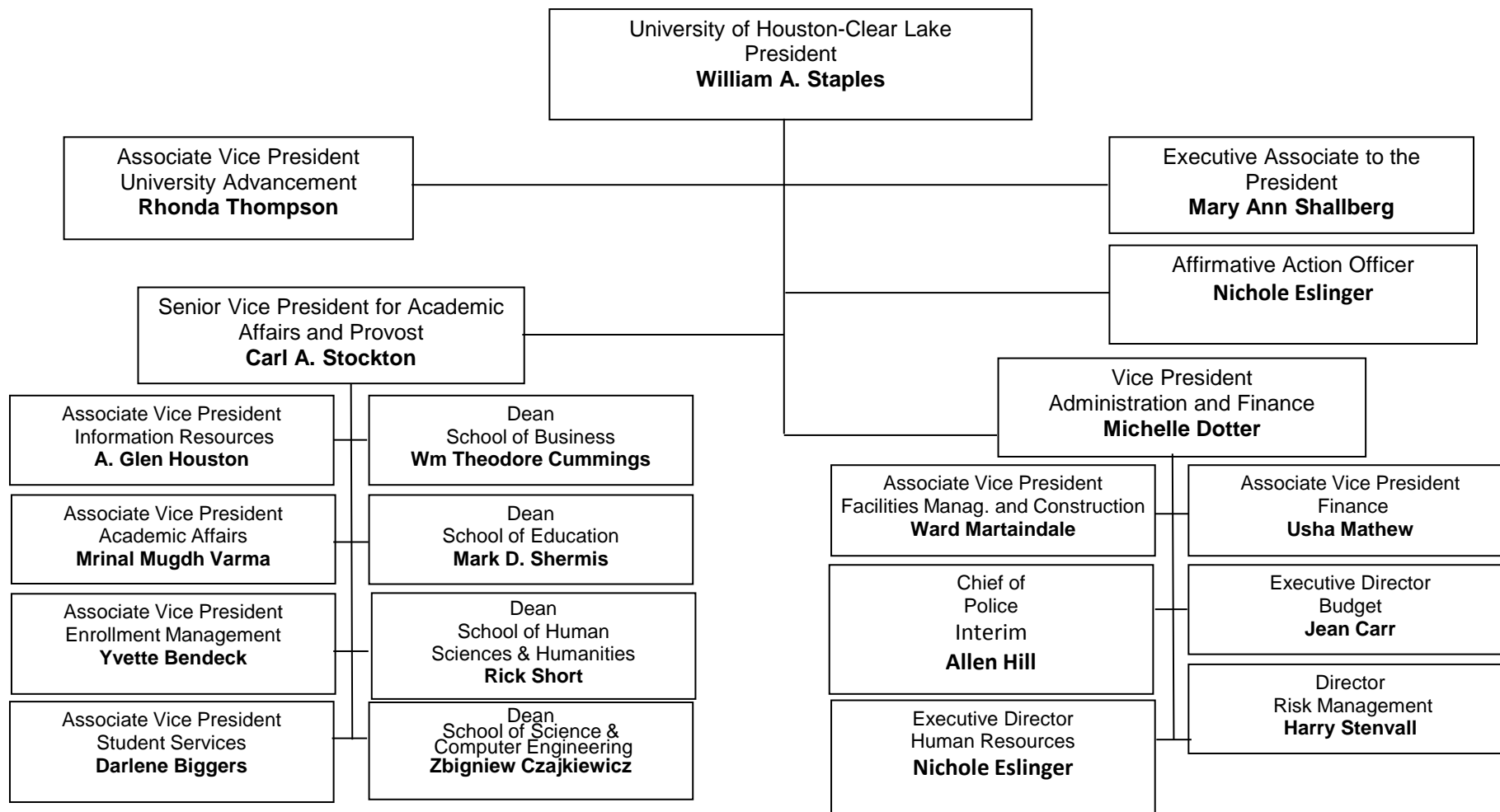

Note: This report consists of a 5-year graduation study based on the total degrees awarded for a fiscal year. The information presents actual UHCL CBM-009 certified graduate data extracted from a PeopleSoft query for inclusion of each student's most current academic plan record to obtain school information and mean number of terms to receive degree. Data files used: An OIE query using the uhcb cbm009 tables titled MLB_GRADUATION_TRENDS_2REPORT. Degrees Conferred numbers are based on the reporting year variable and not the academic year variable. If variance exists when comparing these figures to other previously published reports, it is important to note that these data may follow a different methodology. Totals by school and classification have all been verified with actual certified THECB reports and the number of terms to complete degree were verified for accuracy by sampling individual student records and asking the UH CB programmer to verify variables - these data will differ from previously published reports. Degree is based on CIP code certified with the THECB. Note: In some instances a CIP code was given an additional digit at the end, to further disaggregate the data (i.e. 51070100 to 510701002).

For Mean Number of Terms (to Receive Degree): The CBM009 Extract obtains the completion terms from the Academic Degree table when the confer date is between the current and previous fiscal year and obtains the required terms from the most recent academic program up to the completion term. It then counts the number of terms between the required term and the completion term. The first term the student entered the institution is the term chosen even if the student dropped out for a term or more. For questions please contact OIE. Thank you.

Any graduate-level section, whether composite, cross-listed, or individual, with fewer than 5 graduate-level registrants and a total enrollment of fewer than 10 registrants will be considered a small class. Small classes currently generate state funded hours. **Special Note:** If your course was miscoded (i.e., you listed it as a lecture rather than an individualized or thesis course)--your average class size will be lower than it should be. **Courses with 3 or fewer students** were excluded for this purpose.

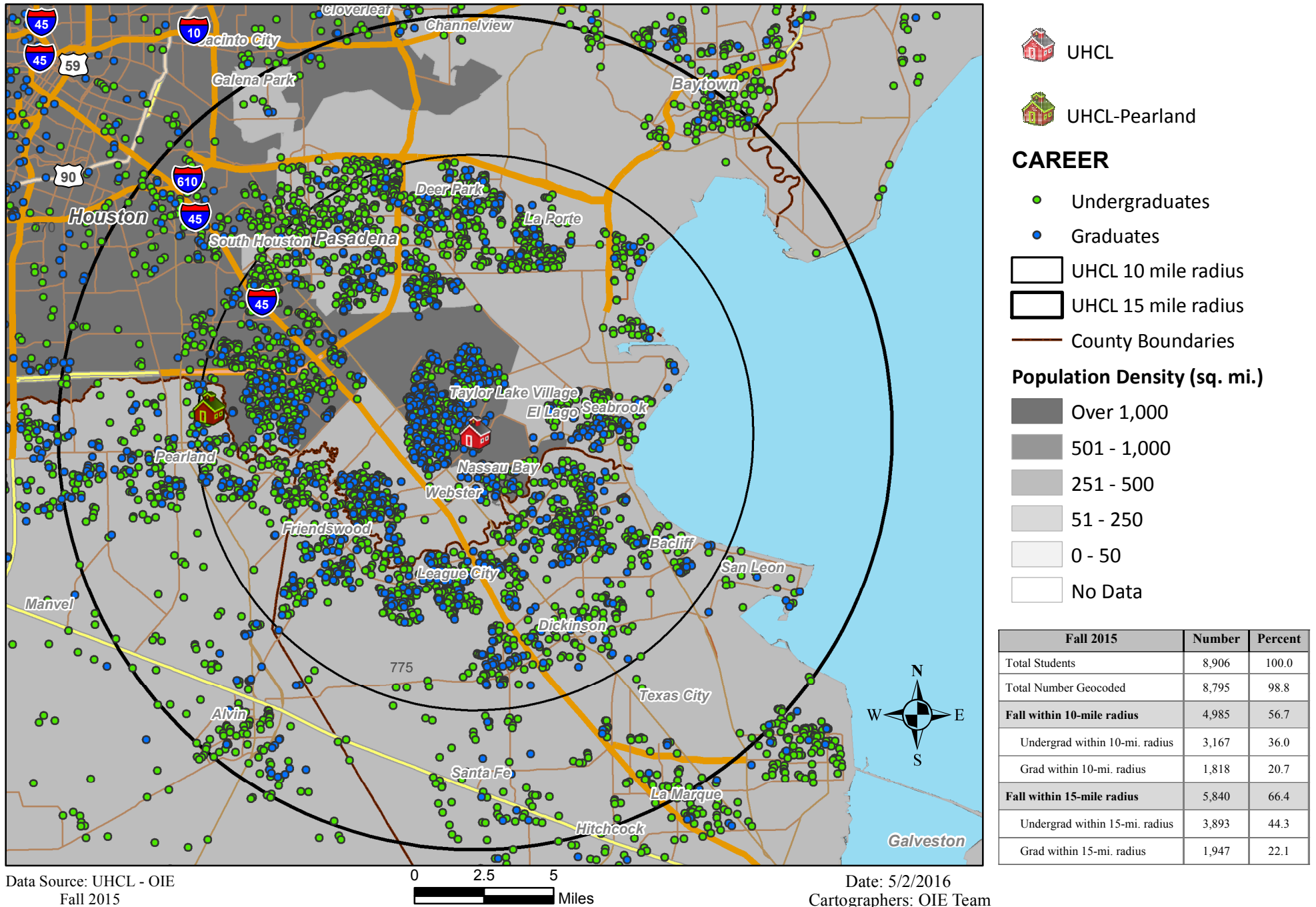

Total UHCL - Student Level Distribution by Residence

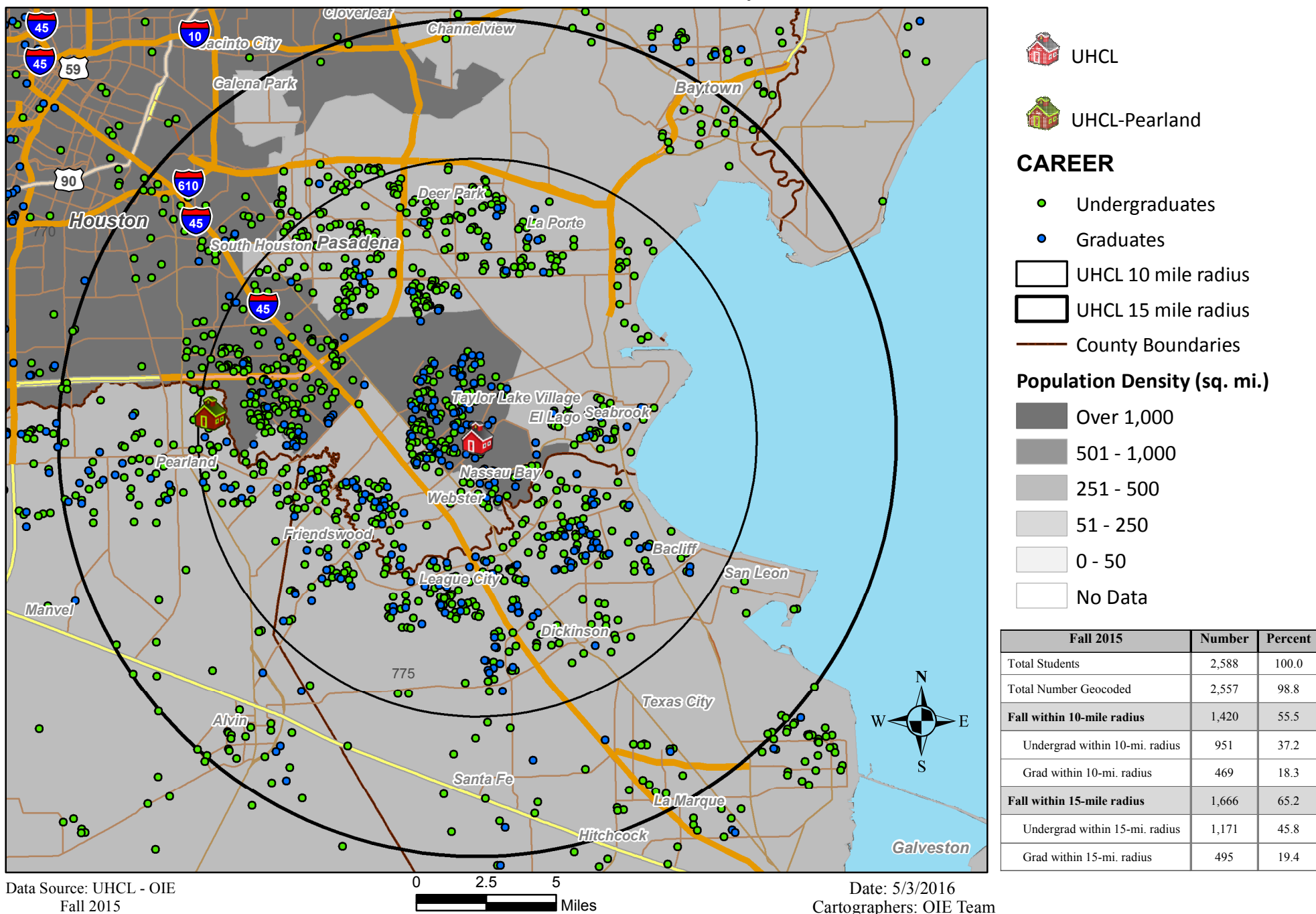

School of Business - Student Level Distribution by Residence

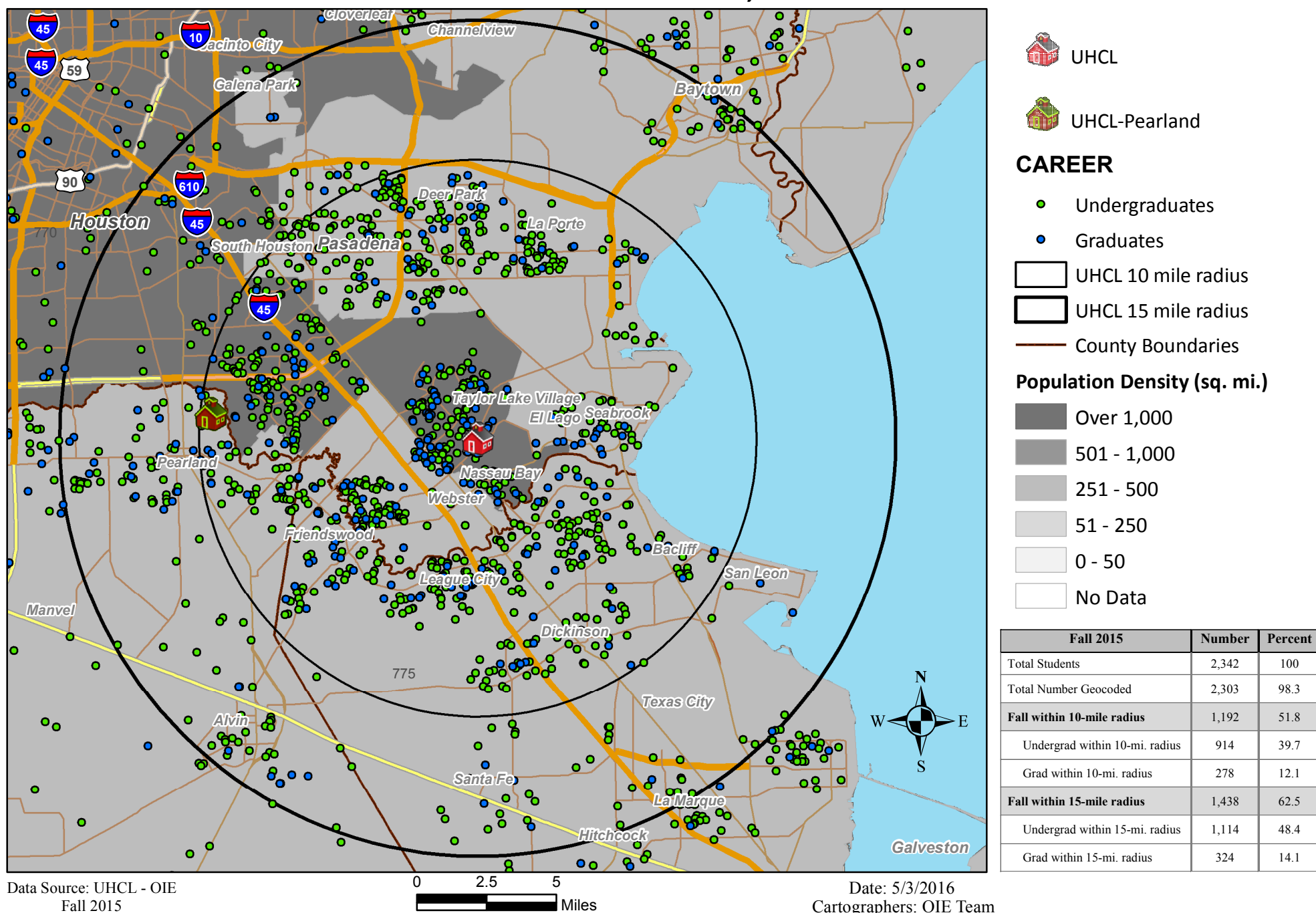
Within 10- & 15-mile Radius of UHCL, Fall 2015

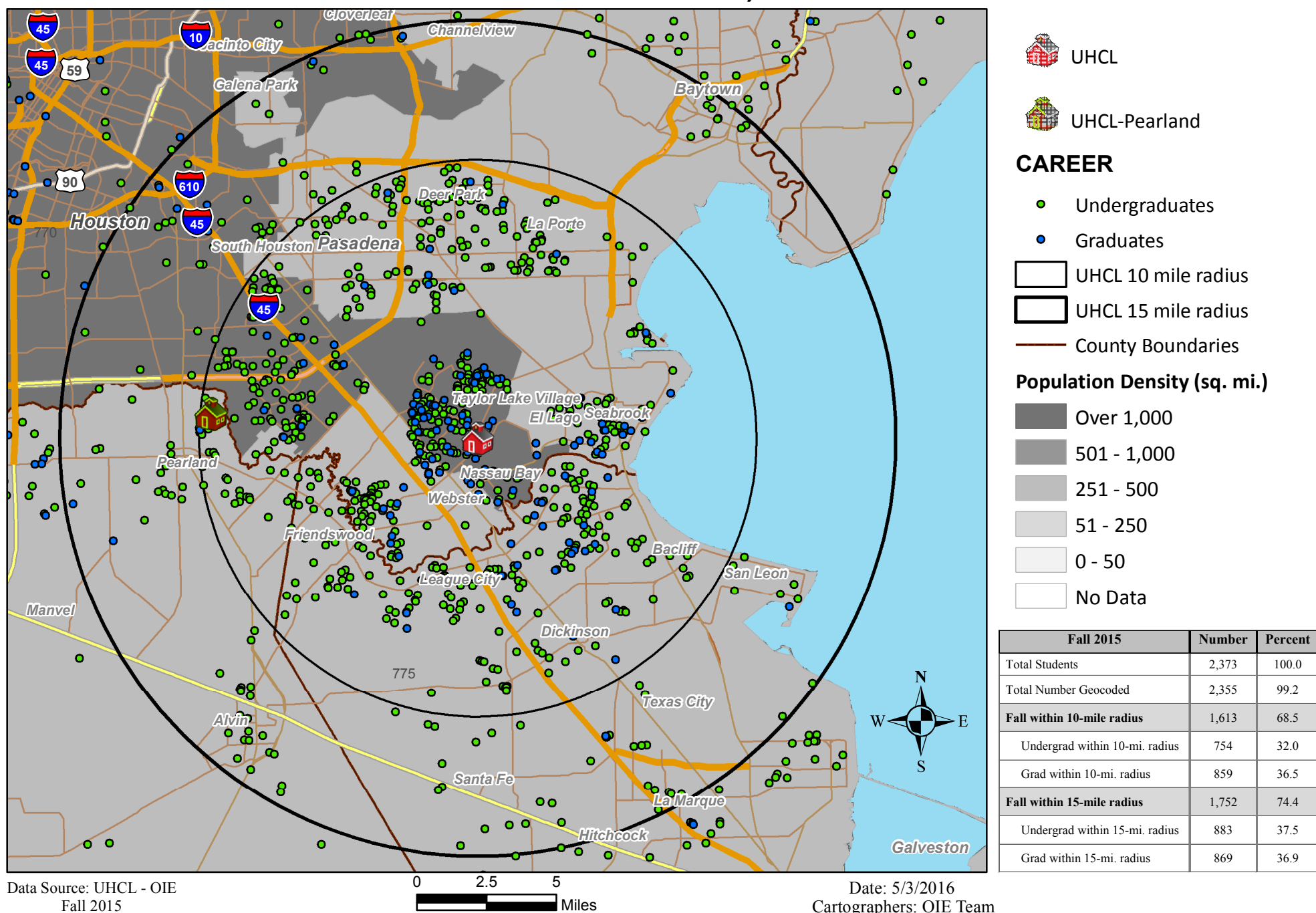
School of Human Sciences and Humanities - Student Level Distribution by Residence

School of Science and Computer Engineering - Student Level Distribution by Residence

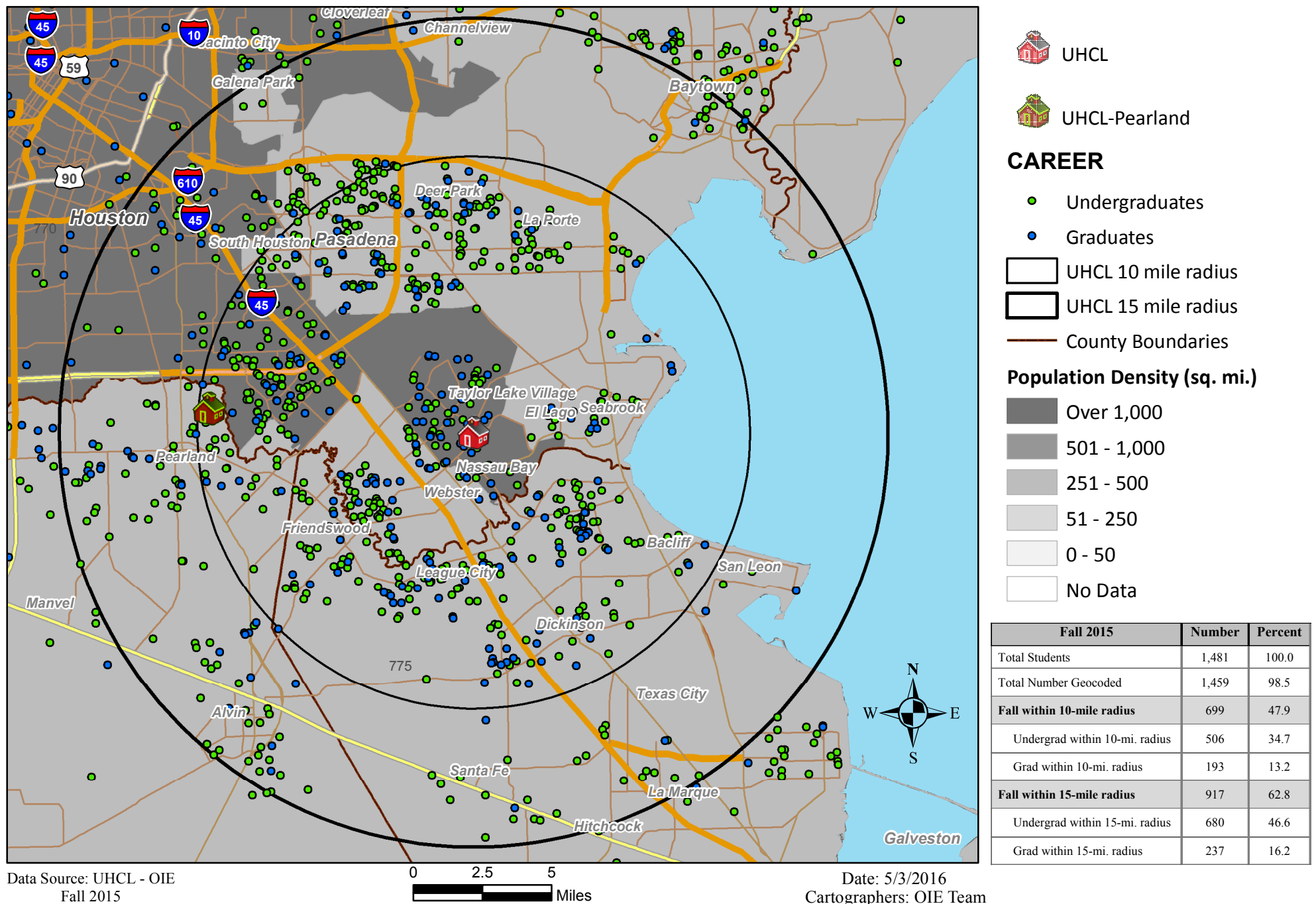

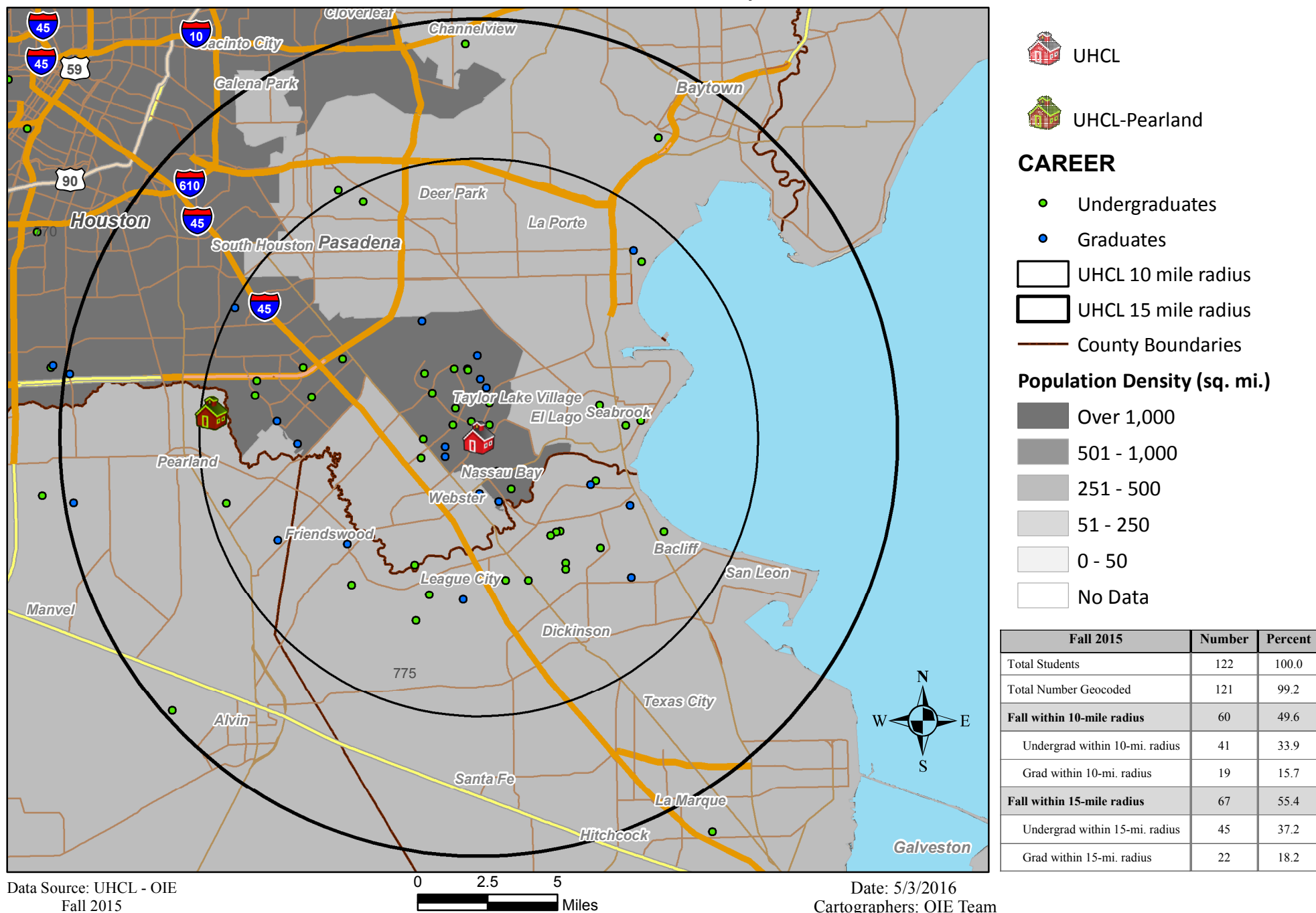
School of Education - Student Level Distribution by Residence

Within 10- & 15-mile Radius of UHCL, Fall 2015



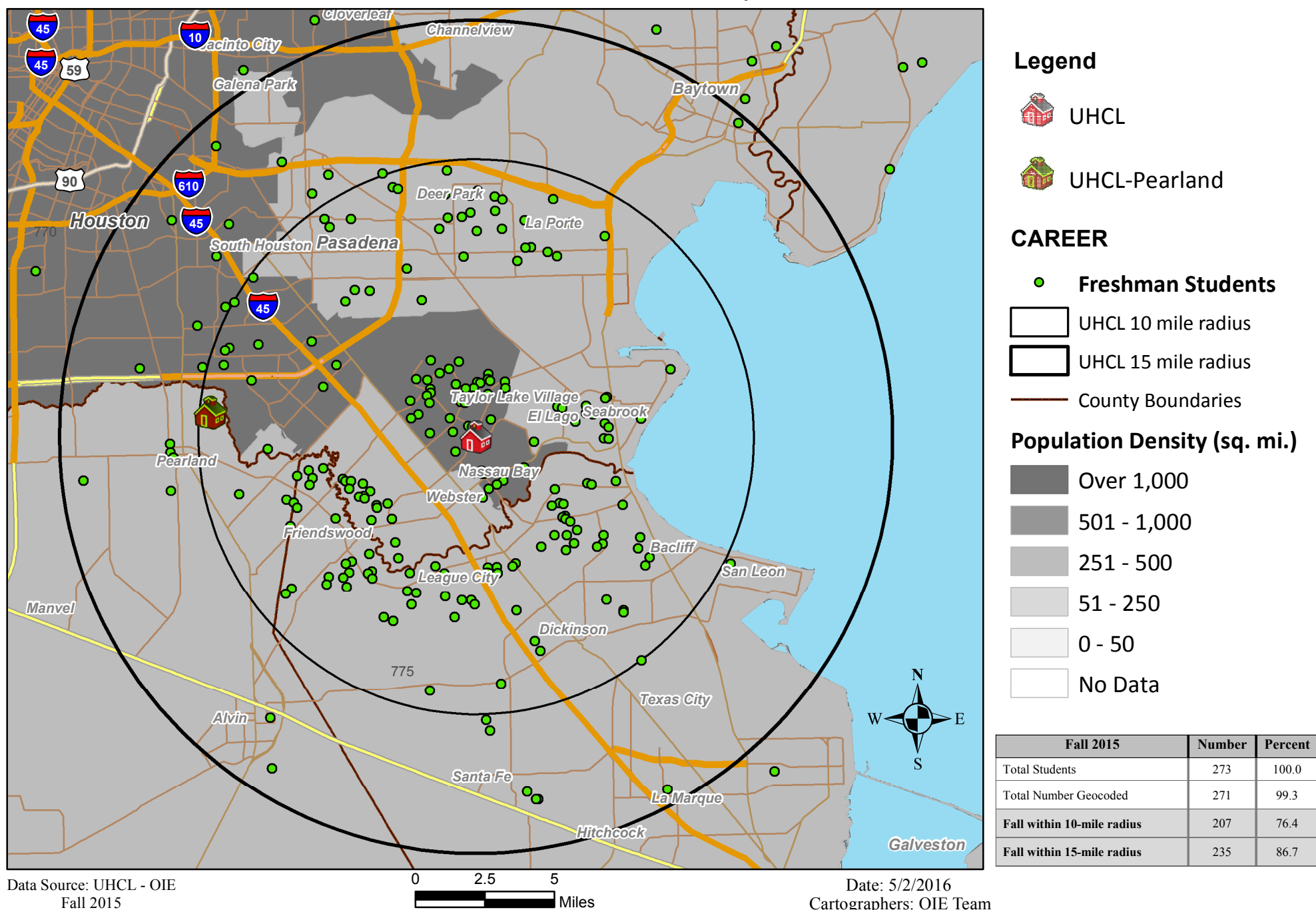
Undeclared Majors - Student Level Distribution by Residence

4. Summarize the FTE salaries (results of step 3) of ONLY the faculty who have percents of time assigned to appointments 01 and/or 02.
5. Tally all faculty with appointment codes 01 and/or 02 where FTE salaries are greater than zero.
6. Divide the total faculty with appointment codes 01 and/or 02 (results of step 5) into the total FTE salaries of faculty with 01 and/or 02 appointments (results of step 4) to yield the average nine-month FTE salaries.

Community College Advisory Council 2015-2016

When UHCL was established in 1971, the legislation provided for a statutorily created council of community and junior college presidents to advise the university president. This is the only such statutorily created advisory council in the state of Texas.

The statute provides for the Community College Advisory Council to consist of presidents/chancellors of each tax-supported community and junior college in Harris, Galveston, Fort Bend, Waller, Montgomery, Liberty, Chambers, and Brazoria counties. At the university's initiative, a bill was introduced and passed into law during the 1991, legislative session to add Wharton to the list of counties.

The legislation calls for the advisory council to "periodically study the overall needs of the region ... for the development of programs and resources in higher education, and as a result of its studies shall make recommendations to the board of regents of the University of Houston [System] regarding the development of the departments and degree programs of the [University of Houston-Clear Lake]. The board of regents shall give careful consideration to the recommendations of the advisory council."

The interaction of UHCL with its community and junior college partners is widely acknowledged as a state and national model of institutional cooperation and has been instrumental in the success of the university.

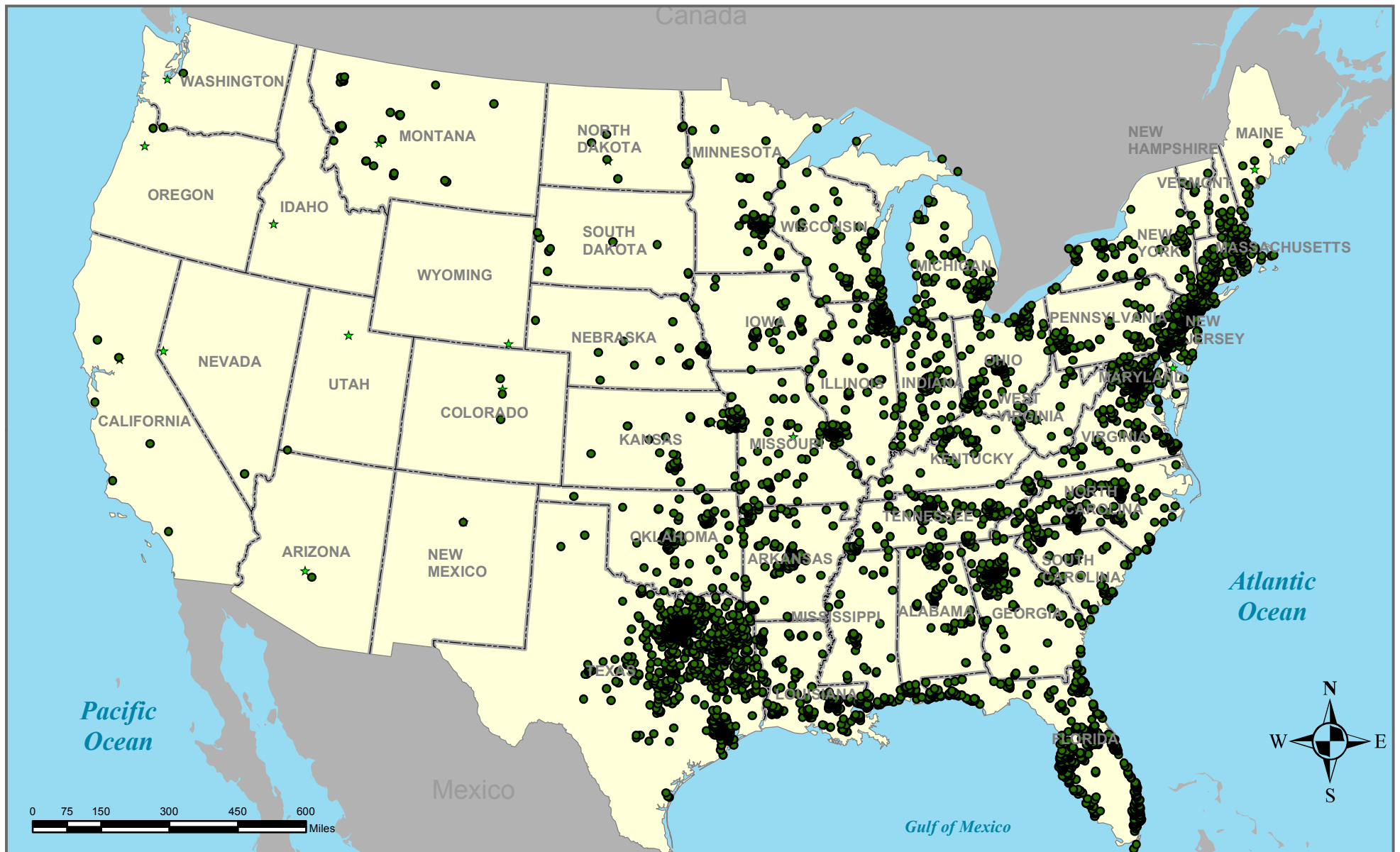
