

SEABROOK HOME OWNERS URGED TO VOICE OPINIONS ON PROS AND CONS OF SAND PIT ISSUE!

Seabrook Hearing January 11

SEABROOK—A Public Hearing will be held Tuesday night, January 11 at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

Purpose of the hearing is for residents to voice opinions ---pro and con---on the proposed sale of the Mahler Sand Pits for sanitary land fills.

Under state regulations, before the Pits could be approved for sanitary land fill operations, expensive core samples have to be taken to determine the density of clay content.

Fred Mahler, owner of the land, before spending thousands of dollars for the core samples, wanted the approval of City Council that he may sell the property for sanitary land fills—thus having the land reclaimed in a few years.

Before Council would act on the request, they decided to hold a public hearing to acquaint citizens with the facts of a possible sanitary landfill within the City limits of Seabrook.

Every homeowner, from all sections of the City, is urged to attend the informal, question and answer period planned for the Public Hearing to seek information on any phase of the proposed land fill program they may not understand and to acquaint others with information about land fills they have.

If attendance at the meeting proves too large to be seated in Council chambers, the group will probably recess and reassemble in the Community House across the street from City Hall.

Mayor Larry Sullivan and the Councilmen hope that Seabrook residents will interest themselves in attending the session and letting their views be known.
