CITY COUNCIL BOUND BY RESOLUTION TO ABIDE BY MAJORITY VOTE OF THE PEOPLE!

The City Council has passed a resolution binding itself to the outcome of the Referendum to be held on January 29, 1977, at Seabrook City Hall. The resolution reads as follows:

"NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEABROOK, TEXAS hereby resolves that it will abide by and act in accordance with the wishes of the majority of Seabrook voters as expressed in the said Referendum of January 29, 1977.

A vote FOR is NOT a vote for a lake, but for unlimited expansion of the sand pit.

SEABROOK PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD RECOMMENDS NO!

This Board voted 7 to 1 AGAINST Mayor Campbell's rezoning proposal. The Board's meeting of Wednesday, January 26 1977 resulted in the recommendation that the proposal be dropped. With proper planning and in-depth studies, the program may have some merit in the overall Master Plan of the City. It was pointed out that such a study would take several years and many \$s to accomplish.
