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
Foreword

OIE computed the figure of 44,855 using the following methodology: Current Fall 2007 information: There were 2,171 degrees awarded for the academic year 2006-07 to 2,153 (unduplicated) students. With the added 2,153 the approximate alumni figure should be: 44,855 to date but that figure can only be verified by the Alumni Office. The last figure officially received from the Alumni Office was in Fall 2006 for 42,732.

Role and Scope Statement (Mission)

The University of Houston-Clear Lake is an upper-level educational institution with a distinct identity, whose primary role is to provide fair and equitable learning opportunities to graduate and undergraduate students. The University serves a diverse student population from the state, the nation, and abroad, particularly from the Houston-Galveston metropolitan area by offering programs on and off campus. Reflective of the University's upper-level program orientation, a statutorily created council, composed of the presidents of the area's nine community colleges, advises the University's president.

The University offers a variety of programs in liberal arts and human sciences, education, business and public administration, and the natural and applied sciences (including computer engineering and science). The University emphasizes high standards for teaching and learning in undergraduate, graduate, and professional programs, as well as in collaboration in any doctoral programs. Each program develops the critical thinking, creative, quantitative, communication and leadership skills of students.

The University enhances the educational, economic, cultural, scientific, business, and professional environment of the area. The University is committed to supporting research and scholarship. The University develops and strengthens programs, which support the region's various commercial, engineering, human services and trade sectors, especially the computing, medical, petrochemical and space industries. The University pursues global outreach consistent with the community's international perspective.

The University's faculty, staff, and administrators are committed to providing a humane, responsive, and intellectually stimulating environment for productive learning and working. The University of Houston-Clear Lake emphasizes (a) learning through teaching, research, scholarship, and professional and community service; (b) the advancement of knowledge; (c) delivery of educational opportunities through new instructional technologies and through distance learning; (d) a commitment to high academic standards; (e) sensitivity to the needs of the students and communities served by the institution; and (f) above all, integrity in all institutional functions.



He/she establishes the administrative and academic structure for the University; chairs the University Council as a component of the shared governance structure; promotes academic excellence through planning, budgeting, implementation, and assessment; makes recommendations on legislative appropriations, annual operating budgets, capital construction projects, and priorities for private support. He/she serves as the University's chief external officer, provides leadership for administration and faculty to fulfill the University's mission, and serves as the official representative of the University and as liaison for communication between the System and the administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Senior Vice President and Provost


The Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost serve as the senior administrative and chief academic officer who reports directly to the President of the University. He/she is responsible for all academic administration including academic programs, student affairs, university planning, institutional research, faculty development, computing, library, enrollment management, international programs, sponsored programs, and research institutes. Emphasis is placed on responsiveness to university constituencies and working through a strong, shared governance model. The Provost is also involved in partnerships with the private sector, government, and other educational institutions. Providing leadership and support of the development of the learning assessment and institutional effectiveness plan is also a major responsibility of the position.

Vice President for Administration and Finance


The Vice President for Administration and Finance is the chief fiscal and business officer of the University and reports directly to the President. He/she is responsible for maintaining the fiscal integrity of the institutions financial and facilities planning and development, management of physical plant, safety and police, operational, business, auxiliary, and personnel services.

The Associate Vice President for University Advancement reports directly to the President and serves as the university's chief external relations officer. He/she directs the offices of development, alumni and community relations, and communications; provides leadership and support to advance the University's vision, mission and strategic goals; and plans, coordinates, and executes the University's resource development including direct contact with individuals, corporations, foundations and alumni. The AVP for University Advancement represents the University as a public advocate throughout the region.


Average Organized Class Size by School and Student Classification




Student 10-Year Headcount Trend Data Fall 1998 to Fall 2007






Headcount Trends









Student Credit Hour Trends







Health Center

The mission of the Health Center is to promote academic excellence, retention, and graduation through optimizing the health of students, faculty, and staff. We also promote the wellness of clients through proactive health education and services. Health Center services are available to all currently enrolled full and part-time students, as well as all faculty and staff.

The Health Center provides clients with several no and low cost services, which include, but are not limited to:

- Nursing Assessments
- Health Counseling and Education
- Physician's Services Internal Medicine and Psychiatry
- Woman's Health Services
- Laboratory Services
- Immunizations/Travel Medicine
- Student Health Insurance

In addition to these services, the Health Center staff also promotes community outreach service. The Health Center also houses a Class D Pharmacy, which has a limited formulary in order to meet state requirements. The center also offers acupuncture sessions twice a month and offers a "quiet room" which often provides privacy for nursing mothers.

Health Services is comprised of a team of trained medical professionals including physicians, nurses, and support staff. We take pride in our medical capabilities and appreciate the opportunity to provide the University with health services.

Disability Services

Disability Services at UHCL exists in order to promote academic excellence, retention, and graduation by ensuring that members of the UHCL community with disabilities have access to all of the programs and activities offered by the University.

Disability Services offers accommodations to students in compliance with Section 504 and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Equal access to university resources are facilitated through accommodations which are made on an individual basis.

IISS promotes and enhances awareness of cultural pluralism through programming and serves as a platform that empowers underrepresented, first-generation and international students.

Goals

The goals of the Intercultural & International Student Services Office are to:

- assist students with their transition to UHCL
- provide edu-cultural programming and resources
- nurture leadership skills
- cultivate inter/ intra- organizational collaboration
- promote participation in the university culture
- maintain community outreach and partnerships
- facilitate mentorship opportunities
- offer scholarship information
- serve as a referral source
- foster life-long learning

Programs and Services

On average, approximately 2,000 students directly participate in IISS sponsored programs and services each semester. These programs and services include:

Multicultural Awareness Experiences—On-going educational programs provide the UHCL community participants the opportunity to enhance their global perspectives. We have various programs and events throughout the year that focus on all types of cultures. For example, we try to have events to recognize Hispanic Heritage Month, Black History Month, Native American Heritage Month, etc. We also have an on-going speaker series, Voices of Colour, where we invite guests to speak on various enriching topics.

National Coalition Building Institute (NCBI)—The UHCL-NCBI Campus Affiliate is an alliance of campus members who work together to create a welcoming environment for all groups, build coalitions among people and promote understanding and appreciation of diversity. Diversity training workshops are offered through campus-wide workshops, student organizations and in classrooms.

Student Advocacy—All students with concerns, problems, or students seeking advice may request assistance from the staff of IISS. The staff serves as a resource and advisor to individuals and groups of students. Additionally, when needed, the staff serves as mediator in conflict situations.

Intercultural and International Student Services

Programs and Services continued

Resource Center—The Office maintains a collection of periodicals, books, training manuals, newsletters, audiotapes, and videos on a variety of cultural topics. A checkout procedure allows campus community members to use the materials to enhance their educational development.

Women's and LGBT Services — A program that is committed to providing programs that serve the needs of women and LGBT constituencies. We are dedicated to working with groups of all backgrounds, ages, abilities, and educational status. The program complements the mission of the IISS Office to support and advocate on behalf of all students.

Celebrating Our Elders (COE)—COE is a scholarship project supported by the University of Houston-Clear Lake. The program builds partnerships between the university, Houston-area high schools, area community colleges and the Hispanic and African-American communities to further their educational opportunities.

Educational Partnerships

A variety of partnerships are undertaken to assist students in their educational growth, including:

- Strictly Speaking Program assists international students in improving their spoken English skills by pairing international students with US students.
- Total Success Plus (TS+) is a mentoring program where students are paired with a UHCL faculty or staff mentor.
- Make the Connection is a tutoring resource where we try to assist students with finding tutors and/or utilizing other tutoring services on-campus.
- A variety of cultural programs are designed to enhance the campus community members' understanding of different cultural practices, beliefs, and histories. Some of these include Eid, Diwali, Lunar New Year, Cinco de Mayo, Dia de los Muertos, and Cultural Extravaganza. Some of these programs are directly sponsored by IISS, while others are co-sponsored or supported by IISS.

The Dean of Students Office is committed to providing a student-centered, co-curricular atmosphere that enhances the academic mission of the university, and embraces the belief that learning is not confined solely within traditional classroom boundaries. In choosing UHCL, we hold students to the viewpoint that they have become a part of our community of scholars. As part of the UHCL experience, we expect students to make academics and being involved their highest priorities. Through programs, services, and interactions provided by the Dean of Students Office, students are expected to become citizens, dynamic leaders, and individuals who are guided by sound ethical decision making. We are steadfast in our philosophy to challenge and support UHCL students to broaden their world view in a campus culture that respects individual differences. The Dean of Students staff is responsive to student needs and interests.

Primary Services and Activities

Information Service – This includes distributing information about UHCL, maintaining and producing a Student Services Resource Book, and developing campus resources, flyers, banners, and resource cards. In addition, the office serves as a liaison between UHCL offices and programs

Dean of Students – The Dean of Students assists all students by providing advocacy to resolve conflicts, develop strategies for addressing both individual and campus-wide concerns, and serves as a liaison to other university offices on behalf of the student body. The Dean of Students Office also enforces the Student Code of Conduct and acts as a disciplinary hearing officer for the campus. The dean also develops and initiates retention strategies for the division.

Student Assistance Center (SAC) – The SAC is the first stop for registration assistance and general university information. SAC's primary role is to advocate and aid students in resolving inter-departmental issues. SAC provides assistance with E-Services; adding/dropping classes; explaining fee statements and class schedules; assistance with payment options, help with admissions applications, and assistance with applying for financial aid. SAC also validates student ID cards, updates student records, processes transcripts, and more..

Current Initiatives

- Promote an understanding and appreciation for the University Level Student Learning Outcomes.
- Design and implement the Student Assistance Center (i.e., "One Stop Shop" concept), which is located in the new student services classroom building.
- Create a comprehensive retention plan for the University and Student Services under the auspices of the Strategic Enrollment Management Team that will further the mission of both the University and the division.
- Continue to explore ways to enhance student services and programs through the use of technology

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The Student Life Office exists to serve and educate students and the university community by creating a supportive environment that provides opportunities for personal, social, and intellectual development. Community College Advisory Council

2007-2008

When UHCL was established in 1971, the legislation provided for a statutorily created council of community and junior college presidents to advise the university president. This is the only such statutorily created advisory council in the state of Texas.

The statute provides for the Community College Advisory Council to consist of presidents/chancellors of each tax-supported community and junior college in Harris, Galveston, Fort Bend, Waller, Montgomery, Liberty, Chambers, and Brazoria counties. At the university's initiative, a bill was introduced and passed into law during the 1991 Legislative session to add Wharton to the list of counties.

The legislation calls for the advisory council to "periodically study the overall needs of the region ... for the development of programs and resources in higher education, and as a result of its studies shall make recommendations to the board of regents of the University of Houston [System] regarding the development of the departments and degree programs of the [University of Houston-Clear Lake]. The board of regents shall give careful consideration to the recommendations of the advisory council."

The interaction of UHCL, as an upper-level university, with its community and junior college partners is widely acknowledged as a state and national model of institutional cooperation and has been instrumental in the success of the university.


